

How does a Parent/Carer know how their child is getting on in school, and what their child is being taught?

What is being taught?

We publish our school curriculum on the website.

We follow a two year rolling programme in years 1 to 4.

Each term the class teacher will send out information on the learning that is to take place during the term.

How does a Parent/Carer know how their child is getting on in school?

Parent Meetings.

- We hold Parent Meetings for all year groups in the Autumn term and again in the Spring Term.
- Progress is explained at both of these meetings and suggestions for how you can help your child.
- The children's books will be available to view in the School Hall during the Parent Meetings.
- Staff are available to speak to before and after school should you have any concerns.

School Reports

An annual report is written at the end of the academic year to reflect your child's progress, their attitude to learning and their achievements through the year. This is also set against national expectations (KPI) for the year group. Parents respond to this report in writing but additional meetings are also offered as requested/ necessary.

Progress review meetings

Individual meetings regarding progress are held between teachers and the Head teacher during the year. If, from a progress review a concern regarding progress is arising, we will discuss next steps for your child with you accordingly.

If your child needs additional support we may suggest they have targeted intervention support and they will have an Individual Education Plan [IEP]. We will provide you with termly updates on their progress.
