Welcome back! I hope you all had a lovely break. It has been an absolute delight getting to know your wonderful children in Diamonds class so far.

This term in Diamonds class we are going to be looking at growing and minibeasts. We will be doing various activities such as; planting our own plants and watching them grow, looking at how plants grow and what they need to grow and also creating our own minibeast creatures. The story we are focussing on for this topic is Jack and the Beanstalk.

In Maths this term we will be focussing on counting to 20 using objects. We will be looking at different ways to count 20 using various maths resources such as; tens frames, counters, cubes and numicon.

In Literacy/Phonics this term, we will be looking at phase 3 phonics. We will be really focussing on using our sounds correctly and blending them together in words. We will also be looking at letter/number formation. Please be aware we will be sending home letter fans with the sounds and we would appreciate your support in helping them learn them.




