1	Read your child's favourite story book. Can they	
	re-tell the story in their own words? What	
	happened? What was their favourite part?	
2	Write your child's name on a piece of paper and	
	cut it into pieces. Can they put the letters in the	
	correct order to spell their name?	
3	Make slime using the recipe below:

	Encourage children to talk about what the slime	
	feels like. Can they roll it? Make a ball? How long	
	can they roll the slime?	
4	Go on to the Ceebebies website and watch some	
	of the Phonics videos:

5	Make a pasta necklace with dried pasta and a	
	piece of string or pick up small objects with	
	chopsticks/tweezers/pegs and practise putting	
	them into pots. Activities like these will help to	
	develop the muscles in your child's hand ready for writing.	
6	Go on a shape hunt around the house. What	
	shapes can you see? Can you find a square,	
	rectangle, circle or triangle?	
7	Find different amounts of objects around the	
	house with numbers to 5. E.g. 2 apples, 3 pillows.	
8	Watch the Numberblocks episode on counting to	
	5.

9	Use natural materials to create a repeating	
	pattern. E.g. flowers, stones, leaves.	
10	Have a colour hunt around the house. 'Can you	
	find me somethinggreen, yellow, red, blue?' See	
	how many your child can find in a certain amount	
	of time!
