	<u>Challenge</u> : You need to write your expanded noun phrases into sentences, for example, 'There is a long, grey sofa in the middle of my living room.'	
2	Paragraphs - it's research time! Either using a non-fiction book or the internet, find interesting facts about three different animals. You need to write a paragraph for each animal so you should have three paragraphs when you finish	
	Challenge: Choose your favourite fact about each animal as well as your least favourite fact. Explain why you have chosen them	
3	Diary entry - sit down and think about a fun day that you had recently. You are going to be writing a diary entry (Dear Diary,) telling me about that exciting day. Talk about the different things that you did, why you enjoyed it, how it made you feel and if there was anything that you would change. Don't forget to write your name at the end	
	<u>Challenge</u> : Go back through your writing and check for any mistakes - have you missed any capital letters or full stops? Could you add more interesting vocabulary?	
4	Adverbs - finish these sentences using adverbs (words usually ending in '-ly'  - The boy ran  - Her dog barked , she picked up the sharp glass.  - His Mum tiptoed into the room.  - They danced to the music.  - "Where are my keys?' shouted Dad  - I gave them the last piece of cake.  - The sun was hot so the ice cream melted.  Challenge: use a variety of conjunctions to extend the sentences above. Check that they make sense by reading them out loud to an adult, and but because so if etc.

You will need a piece of paper that has been sectioned off into 6 boxes (get an adult to help you)  Challenge: Make sure that your character(s) have speech bubbles and that you have	

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used captions to explain what is happening in your story
