

What a wonderful end to the half term! The children have enjoyed a really busy week and it has been a pleasure to walk around the school and see all of the wonderful things going on in every classroom. In Diamonds Class this week the children have been exploring the numbers to five in their Maths lessons. They have learnt how to record the numbers using the numeral, tally marks, spots and actions. In their Art lessons this week they have been mixing colours and creating handprints using paints. In Key Stage One this week the children really enjoyed their topic day spent learning more about The Great Fire of London. It was super to see the children engaged in really fun and enjoyable activities such as making and baking bread, making Samuel Pepys character masks, using quills and ink, dancing and making Tudor houses using boxes. On Wednesday the children in Key Stage Two went on the Faith Tour to Bedford. The children visited a Christian Church, a Sikh Gurdwara and an Islamic Mosque.
