Children's Learning

I have been delighted to see all of the children's amazing learning this week. In Diamonds Class I was very impressed with the children's perseverance and determination in their PE lesson on Monday. The children learnt how to hold and use a hockey stick and were encouraged to show good control when dribbling the ball. Despite the bad weather they kept trying and by the end of the session they had developed some really good skills. In their RE lesson this week they continued to learn all about why Christmas is important to Christians. They were able to cut and stick parts of the nativity story into the correct order. In Key Stage One this week the children have used their Maths lessons to continue to learn all about money. They have been making different amounts using a variety of coins and they have been learning to count in 2s, 5s and 10s using coins. In their English lessons this week the children listened to the 'Owl Babies' story by Martin Waddell. They enjoyed acting out the story using speech and worked hard to write a version of the story in their own words. In Key Stage Two this week the children have started a new topic in their English lessons based on the text 'The Polar Express' by Chris Van Allsburg. They were joined by some of the Year 2 children and have been writing descriptions of the train and thinking carefully about adjectives, adverbs, similies and inference. In their RE lesson this week the children have been continuing to learn all about how and why people mark the significant events in their life. We have been learning about religious and non-religious events such as Jewish Bar Mitzvah, Christian Baptism, birth and marriage in different faiths and the Hindu Upanayana ceremony.

Winter Weather

As the bad weather begins to set in, I would just like to remind everyone to take extra care when walking on any icy ground and/or pavements, and whilst driving on the icy roads.

Also, please ensure that your child is wearing suitable shoes to school, as this will help them avoid falling over in the event of bad weather. It is fine for children to come to school in outdoor boots and then change into their school shoes once inside.

School Closure:

Should the school not be open due to bad weather the following will happen:

- A Parentmail message will be sent before 8:00am on that day.
- The home page of the website will be updated with information.
- We will post an update on our schools Facebook account.

It is also possible for you to receive an update directly from Central Bedfordshire Council. In order to receive this update, you will need to register on Central Bedfordshire Council's SOS system:

- Enter: https://apps.centralbedfordshire.gov.uk/webApps/SOS/ on your computer
- Click on 'register for updates' and fill in the text boxes
- Click on 'submit'

You will then receive an email that contains instructions on how to 'activate' your account, which will include a 'one off' activation, code:

- Click on the link
- Go to 'Log in to edit your details' and type in your email address and the activation code. The next time you want to edit your details, type in your email address and password.

Please make sure that the school office has your up to date contact details. Your support in this matter is always very much appreciated.

If the School is Open:

- Arrive in suitable footwear don't forget your hat, scarf and gloves.
- Bring a change of shoes.
- Bring a change of clothes jogging bottoms are a good idea.

It is the parents' decision as to whether or not it is safe to travel, please do not take any risks if you live some distance away.

Children may be allowed to play out in the snow, but the school makes a daily risk assessment to assess the suitability of children playing outside. We do not allow children to throw snowballs.

Please ensure that children have a change of clothing with them to change out of wet clothing. If there is heavy snow during the day, please collect your child early if you wish to do so.

It is the school's responsibility to clear and grit one main pathway around the school in times of ice and snow. Please keep to the cleared pathway. The school cannot be held responsible if parents choose to walk on un-cleared pathways.

Raffle Tickets

Tickets are now on sale and can be obtained from the school office or by sending money into school in a named envelope. There will also be an opportunity to buy tickets at the Christmas Plays. Tickets are priced at just 50p each or £2 for a strip. We use this money to pay for the little extras that we get for the children over the year.

We will draw the winners at 3pm on **Tuesday 19th December**, this will be outside the classrooms just before pick up time.

Your child can still bring a packed lunch for that day, if they would prefer.

If your child would like to wear a **Christmas Jumper** (with their normal school uniform) on this day, they are welcome to do so!
