Children's Learning

It has been lovely to see all of the wonderful things that the children have been learning about this week. In Diamonds Class this week the children have been looking at the fairy story the three little pigs. They were encouraged to retell the story in their own words and write some simple words and sentences to explain what happened in the story. The children also enjoyed creating a character from the story in their Art lesson. In their Phonics work this week the children have been learning the sounds x, y, z and zz. Miss Grahame uses the Twinkl phonics scheme to teach the children their letter sounds and we have been very impressed with how well the children are doing with their segmenting and blending skills. In Key Stage One this week the children started their new History topic on nurturing nurses. They started the topic by thinking about people who are important to them and significant people in the past and in their own lives. In their RE lesson this week the children started their new topic on how and why different religious groups celebrate special times. In Key Stage Two this week the children started their new Science topic on magnets. They talked all about forces and learnt to identify different types of pushes and pulls. In their History lesson this week the children started their new topic on the Anglo Saxons. They learnt some key information to help them to understand why, where and when the Scots and Anglo-Saxons invaded Britain.

Learning at Home

We would like to remind everyone about the amazing opportunities that the children have to continue to learn at home. We are very lucky to have access to several online learning sites which the children can access from home using a username and log in. One of these resources is Giglets https://giglets.com/. This website can be used for reading at home. It is especially good for our families who speak another language at home as there are lots of books which are available in different languages. Improvements in School

You may have noticed the skip at the edge of our playground this week. We have been very fortunate to be able to use some of our funding to purchase new carpets for the Key Stage One and Two classrooms and the entrance hall and offices. We are sure that you will agree that they make the school environment look really smart and they will be much nicer for the younger children to sit on during learning time. We have also spent some time improving the Early Years outside garden area. We have had artificial grass fitted and have purchased some new resources to help the Diamonds children with their outdoor learning. In addition we were very privileged to receive some funding from Harmony Energy which we used to purchase some new eco resources such as planters, log cabins and bug hotels for our nature reserve. We are certain that the children will really enjoy using the new outdoor resources especially as the weather starts to improve.
