4	Read a story together, encourage your child to	
	find tricky words in the book as you read. (the,	
	to, no, go, into, I).	
5	Write down 3 letter words to practise sounding	
	and blending. (cat, bat, dog, bed, fog, leg, hen,	
	red).	
	Model sounding out the letters for each word	
	then reading the word to blend.	
6	Go on a letter hunt around the house, what	
	letters can you see? Letters in books, on	
	calendars.	
7	Write the letters in the alphabet.	
	Model each letter for your child and your child	
	can either write over the top of your letters to	
	practise or write them underneath.	
8	Ask your child to draw a picture of a story they	
	have enjoyed. What happened in the story?	
	Who was your favourite character?	
9	Play the balloon phonics game-

	This game focuses on 3 letter words which we	
	are learning in the classroom. Listen to the word	
	and encourage your child to look at the picture	
	to help them, can they find the correct sound for	
	the word?	
	Write big letters from the alphabet on pieces of	
	paper, call out a simple word (dog) and ask your	
	child to point to the correct sound that makes	
	that word and repeat the sound (d for dog).
