

English - writing

Use the postcard template to design and write a postcard to a friend or family member. Choose somewhere you have visited and draw a picture of it on the blank side. On the other side write some sentences to say what you have seen and done in this place.

Challenge: Remember that a postcard is informal, so add some more informal phrases to your writing, such as 'how are you?' or 'I wish you were here because you would love.....'.

Art

We will be looking at the National flags and symbols for the four countries in the UK, as well as the Union Jack.

Design your own flag for the UK or for one of the four countries in the UK. Think about what colours, patterns and images you might want to use on your design.

Challenge: Explain your choice of colours, patterns or images.

PSHE/DT

Using the blank A4 paper, create a flag to represent your family. Think about what your family like to do or eat and choose colours carefully. You might want to choose a different shape for your flag. You can use whatever you like to create your flag, such as ribbon, sequins, stickers or cut out pictures.

Challenge: Present your flag to a family member or friend, explaining why you have chosen certain colours or images
