Use the sentence starters provided to help you form your sentences.

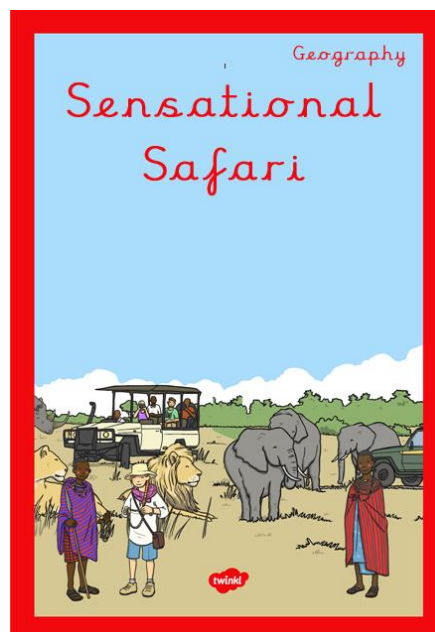
Challenge: Proofread your work – check capital letters are in the correct places, punctuation is used correctly (full stops, commas or exclamation marks) and that your writing makes sense.

PE

In our PE lessons this term we have been learning about putting a sequence of movements together and then performing a sequence. Choose up to 5 animals that live in Africa and decide on a different movement for each one. Decide on the order you want to perform your animal movements and write them down. Practice your sequence and then perform it to your family and/or friends. Maths

With at least one other person, use the Safari animal cards provided to play a game. Divide the cards between the players. Ask the youngest player to choose a category and then invite everyone to share the number on their card for that category. The person with the highest value wins that card from the other players. If two people have the same number then put the cards in the middle and the next winner wins those cards too.

Challenge: Create your own addition number sentences using the numbers and categories. Choose 2 or 3 cards and add the numbers together. For example, what would the danger score be for a lion, a snake and a zebra?

Challenge: Describe your illustrations.
