These activities cover different areas of Literacy such as letter formation, letter recognition, Level 2 and 3 sounds and blending 3 letter words together to read. All of the activities link to the work your child will be completing in class.

Please complete one activity each week during the summer term and tick when you have completed each activity. Activities can be revisited if your child finds any area difficult. Diamonds Literacy Homework - Summer Term

Activity Number	Activity	Completed
1	Using the sound mats, practise the Phase 2 and 3 Phonic sounds.	
2	Show your child a picture, this could be one from a story book and ask them what they can see. Encourage your child to write a sentence about what they can see. E.g. 'I can see a dog and a duck'.	
3	Use your child's log in which is located on the back of their reading record. To play Literacy games on https://www.teachyourmonster.org/ The web version is free to use.	
4	Read a story together on Giglets. Encourage your child to find tricky words in the book as you read. (She, he, me, we, be, was, are, all, they, you, her, my).	
5	Write down the Phase 3 Phonic sounds on pieces of paper. Call out a sound and ask your child to jump onto the piece of paper with that sound on. (If you would like a list of these please feel free to ask).	
6	Play 'Phonics Pop'- children need to pop the bubbles by clicking them with the correct sound on. Choose from any of the sounds in the game from sets 1-7. https://ictgames.com/phonicsPop/index.html	
7	Write the letters in the alphabet. Model each letter for your child and your child can either write over the top of your letters to practise or write them underneath.	
8	Ask your child to design a book cover for their favourite book. What characters are in their favourite book? What happens?	
9	Play some of the phonics games on the Doorway First Phonics website: First Phonics	
10	Practice writing some simple rhyming words. Rhyming words are words that have the same sounds at the end. such as hat, mat, sat, cat.
